

LAKE REPORT

The lake and islands are looking great this spring. The rains this last fall and winter more than refilled the lake and flushed it out. Hopefully we will not need a treatment this summer. It has been great to see so many homeowners recreating on the lake this winter and spring using boats, kayaks, and water boards.

We have some homeowners who have volunteered to help patrol our lake to deter poachers. If you are questioned by them please be respectful and remember all guests of members are required to have a member with them and to pay the restocking fee of \$3.00. It can be deposited in the box near the park fishing beach. We have dropped the fishing password as they proved to be ineffective. Many members did not know the passwords and many non-members did know them.

If launching a water craft please use the boat launch area and then park in the lower park parking area across the lake where your vehicle will be safest and not impede access to the boat launch for others.

There will be no access to the lake, lower park or beach from 68th St starting in mid-August, due to the lower park renovations. Lake access will be limited to the boat access off of McGhee Dr. and you will not be able to cross over the bridge to access the beach for any reason during this time.

PARK REPORT

LOWER PARK WILL GET A NEW LOOK!

Lake Jane Estates was developed in 1959, the lower park has had no upgrades since then. If you visit the lower park you will notice that the sidewalks are cracked, and uneven to walk on. The sidewalks are not handicap accessible and there are a number or drainage issues through out the whole lower lawn area. All of that is about to change.

Late this summer the lower park will be closed for about 5 weeks for extensive renovation. Exciting changes will happen in that time period. Some of the major features are described below.

A wide concrete walkway will run from the parking lot to the shelter, to the swimming beach and to the end of the foot bridge. Gone are the concrete "humps" over the culvert. This walkway will make the new shelter wheelchair accessible starting at the ADA off loading pad in the parking lot. Those folks unsteady on their feet or in wheelchairs will have easy access all the way to the swimming beach.

Two picnic tables on concrete pads will be placed on the swimming beach. One of these tables will be connected to the wheelchair path. People will be able to spread their picnic on a table next to the swimmers.

Our old and well worn gazebo will be replaced by a much larger steel framed rectangular structure with a metal roof. This new shelter will accommodate at least 4 tables allowing more of our members to enjoy the lower park under a roof. A water faucet will be installed next to the shelter.

Area lighting will be increased by adding two light poles, like those large lights in the upper park, from Puget Sound Energy.

It will be hard to miss the two rain gardens. These rain gardens, designed by a landscape architect, will remedy the majority of the soggy areas. They will be placed below the parking lot where so much of the water accumulates. Our members will be able to walk and play on much more of the grass without sinking ankle deep in mud. In addition, the rain gardens will add some interesting and colorful shrubbery to the area. The rain gardens are designed to be low maintenance.

After all the heavy equipment leaves the parking lot will get a new layer of clean gravel. When the job is complete our members will have much more enjoyable and useful park!

During all of this work there will be no access to any areas in the lower park and beach. There will be no access from the bridge either. Lake access will only be allowed from the boat launch off of McGhee Dr. E. This is for the safety of all so all the work can be completed on time and without interference from others.

We thank you for your patience during this time and we all look forward to the great new and improved lower park that we all can enjoy for years and generations to come.


